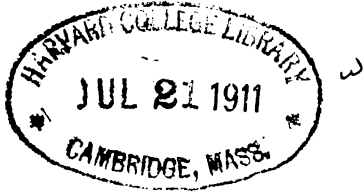

## PREFACE.

---

The purpose of this Directory is to include in one publication a descriptive list of the various organizations in St. Louis interested in public affairs. In campaigns on matters of general public interest, such as the charter campaign in January, 1911, most of the organizations listed were interested in hearing speakers on the topic. Many such organizations, even when purely commercial in their ordinary activities, give attention to these public matters and take a stand concerning them. They thus assist in moulding and expressing public opinion, and are part of the active force in our civic life.

Probably not all such organizations in the city are included, because of our inability to secure information about all for the first publication of this sort. Any omissions should be reported at once to the League's office, 903 Security Building.

The Directory does **not** include organizations which are **purely social, religious, political, fraternal, patriotic or charitable**. Practically all of these will be found listed either in the Gould City Directory, or in the Directory of Charities and Philanthropies, published biennially by the Provident Association, 2122 Locust Street. The Gould City Directory for 1911 contains, between pages 89 to 128, a list of the churches and religious, fraternal, social, political and educational organizations. A complete list of the Catholic organizations, churches and schools of St. Louis, can be found in the Catholic Directory for 1911. A directory of all state, county and city officials, together with much other material, can be found in the Official Manual of the State of Missouri for 1909-1910, published by Cornelius Roach, Secretary of State. Other directories of public officials in St. Louis may be found in the Gould City Directory, pages 77 to 81, and in the Bell Telephone Directory, pages 131 to 132.

Thus, with the publication of this directory of civic and business organizations, we believe that practically all the information of this character of use in civic matters, can be readily obtained.

## NOTE.

All the organizations are arranged alphabetically in the various groups. The words "St. Louis" and "The," when beginning titles are, however, omitted.

The information given for each organization is:

1. Place of meetings.
2. Objects.
3. Frequency of meetings.
4. Number of members.
5. Annual dues.
6. Date of annual meeting.
7. Executive officers.

The address given immediately after the name is the **place of meeting only**, and should not be used as the mailing address of the association, unless it conforms with the address of the secretary. In all cases it is safer to use the secretary's address for mailing purposes. Where no address is given after the name, no regular place of meeting is provided.

The date of the annual meeting (at which officers are elected), is given in order that users of the Directory may revise the Directory from time to time, as officers of the various associations change.

The dues, unless otherwise stated, are annual dues.

The number of members given was the number on record for each association in March, 1911. The information is correct in practically every instance up to May 1, 1911.

Where the information does not appear complete, that is, for instance, where the number of members or the dues do not appear, the information was not furnished in response to inquiry.

All corrections and additions should be sent in to the office of the Civic League, 903 Security Building, for insertion in a supplement, which will be issued when the number of corrections and additions justify it.
