## ST. ELIZABETH INSTITUTE,

Conducted by the Sisters of the Precious Blood,  
Arsenal St., bet. Gravois Road and Grand Ave., St. Louis, Mo.

**T**HIS INSTITUTION has for its peculiar object the training of young ladies, who already possess the usual knowledge of elementary branches, in all that is required to fit them for assuming the duties of capable housekeepers. Besides an education in the ordinary English and German branches of study, the pupils receive practical instructions in all things requisite for women, such as Knitting, Dressmaking, Cutting, Washing, Cooking, Etc. In regard to Sewing, it is so regulated that pupils in the second year, at the furthest, need wear no other clothing except that made by themselves. They may besides at all times be employed in sewing for themselves or their relatives.

The Course of Study for those entering with the requisite elementary knowledge embraces two years. The Scholastic Year begins on the first of September and closes at the end of June. All payments are to be made in advance.

Pupils should be furnished with sufficient underwear and with napkins and towels. Besides their ordinary clothing, all pupils should be provided with a black merino dress, as they are required to be uniformly dressed on Sundays and Holidays.

Finally, each pupil should be furnished with a knife, fork, spoon, drinking cup, besides a tin case with soap, comb, etc.

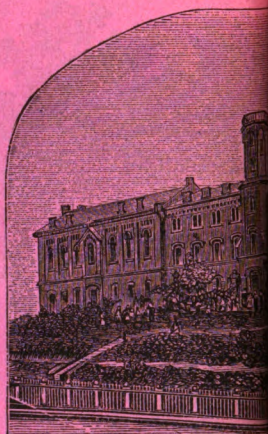
**TERMS:** For board, tuition in all the branches mentioned, and washing, per month, \$14; for use of bed per month, \$1.

**EXTRA:** Tuition—French per month, \$1.50; Music, Piano, per month, \$4; Drawing per month, \$1.50; Instructions in making wax fruits, wax flowers, hair-work and embroidery, each, per month, \$5.

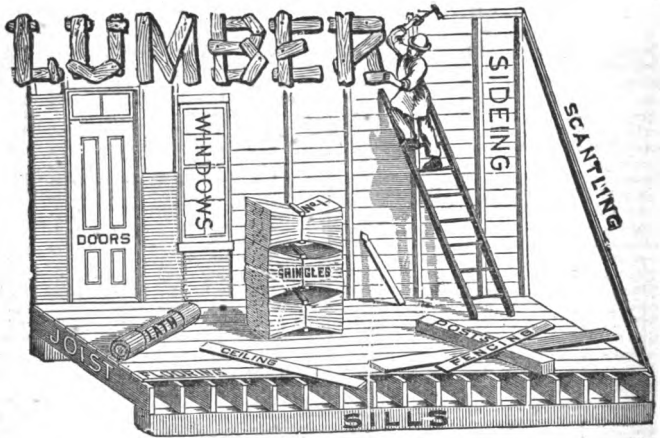

## RATES OF POSTAGE.

**POSTAL CARDS,** 1 cent each, go without further charge to all parts of the United States and Canada. Cards for foreign countries (within the Postal Union) 2 cents each. Postal cards are unmailable with any writing or printing on the address side, except the direction, or with anything pasted upon or attached to them.

**ALL LETTERS,** to all parts of the United States and Canada, 2 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof.

**LOCAL, or "DROP" LETTERS,** that is, for the city or town where deposited, 2 cents where the carrier system is adopted, and 1 cent where there is no carrier system.

**FIRST CLASS.**—Letters and all other written matter, whether sealed or unsealed, and all other matter sealed, nailed, sewed, tied, or fastened in any manner, so that it cannot be easily examined, 2 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof.

**SECOND CLASS.**—Only for publishers and news agents, 1 cent per pound.

**THIRD CLASS.**—Printed matter, in unsealed wrappers only, (all matter inclosed in notched envelopes must pay letter rate) 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof, which must be fully prepaid. This includes books, circulars, chromos, engravings, handbills, lithographs, magazines, music, newspapers, proof-sheets and manuscript accompanying the same, pamphlets, reproductions by the electric pen, hektograph, metallograph, papyrograph, and, in short, any reproduction upon paper by any process except hand-writing and the copying press. Limit of weight 4 pounds, except for a single book, which may weigh more.

**FOURTH CLASS.**—All mailable matter not included in the three preceding classes which is so prepared for mailing as to be easily withdrawn from the wrapper and examined, 1 cent per ounce or fraction thereof. Limit of weight 4 pounds. Full prepayment compulsory.

**REFORWARDING.**—Letters will be forwarded from one postoffice to another upon the written request of the person addressed without additional postage charge; but unclaimed packages cannot be returned to the sender until stamps are furnished to pay the return postage.

**PERMISSIBLE WRITING.**—No writing is permitted on third or fourth class matter except as follows: The name and address of the sender on the outside or inside of the package, preceded by the word "from." On the wrapper may also be written the names and number of the articles inclosed. The sender is further allowed to mark a word or passage in a book or paper to which he desires to call special attention. He may also write a simple inscription or dedication upon the cover or blank leaves of a book or pamphlet. There may be attached to articles of merchandise, by tag or label, a mark, number, name or letter for purpose of identification. Printed circulars may contain the written name of the sender or of the addressee, and the date. Any other writing on third and fourth class matter will subject the package to letter rates of postage, and render the sender liable to a fine of ten dollars for each offense. Printed matter may be inclosed with fourth class matter, but the whole package is subject to the rate of 1 cent per ounce or fraction thereof.

### POSTAL NOTES.

Upon payment of a fee of 3 cents each, Postal Notes for any amount under \$5 may be purchased at any money order office, payable to bearer at any time within three calendar months from the last day of the month during which it was issued; but payable only at such money-order office as the purchaser may select or at the office of issue.
